## President's Message

My wife Helen and I will be traveling to Salt Lake City in late April with other members of our society. I have been trying to determine what ancestors to focus my research on during the week we are there. Ironically, I have recently stumbled onto additional information regarding some of my Irish ancestors who happened to live in the Salt Lake City area in the late 1800's and early 1900's. I was on ANCESTRY.COM researching one of my great-grandmother's brothers whose name is **John M. Fallon**. His name came up in the UTAH WILLS AND PROBATE RECORDS, 1800-1985. These files probably came online within the past year. And, there it was, all 168 pages of his probate record! I couldn't believe it. The amount of information on all those pages was priceless. Unfortunately, John died in July of 1889 and the probate was completed in May of 1890. He was only 43 years of age. His siblings were all listed with their place of residency indicated in the documents. His personal possessions included: half interest in two mining operations in the Park City area, half interest in the ownership of the Cullen Hotel billiard room and saloon, a gold watch and chain, a diamond ring, stud, and collar button, one pair of gold sleeve buttons, and a horse named "Jimbo". I'm still sifting through all the documents for other additional information. Also, I have found numerous historic newspaper articles regarding John Fallon online at the **Library of Congress Historic Newspapers**, **Utah Digital Newspapers**, **Genealogy Bank**, and **NewspapersArchive.com**. As it turned out, he was quite an interesting individual. I am planning on putting together a timeline of his life and possibly a several page story. While in Salt Lake City in April, maybe I can locate where he is buried, find where the Cullen Hotel was located, and see if there are any historic photos of the interior of the old hotel billiard room and saloon.

As I continued searching through the UTAH WILLS AND PROBATE RECORDS, I found John Fallon's sister, **Margaret Fallon Youngson** listed. She was the wife of **Bailey Youngson** who owned the Texas House Saloon in Leadville, Colorado, and was involved in a few gunfights that made the newspapers in the 1880's. In 1888, Bailey was accused of shooting and killing a Leadville Marshall. He was later acquitted and by 1890 he and Margaret had relocated to Salt Lake City. It must have been a difficult family life for the Youngsons with Bailey's troubling background. The PROBATE RECORDS for Margaret (or Maggie as she was known) indicated that she died in November of 1898. The probate records consisted of 32 pages and it appears from her obituary in these documents that she took her own life by poisoning herself. Life with her husband may not have been a pleasant one. But, one key item in the records indicated that there was a 16 year old daughter named Hazel. This I never knew! Now, I have another family line to tract. So, in conclusion, do not overlook any probate records that your ancestors have left behind. They might contain information you've been looking for. Just the two files I have found in Utah opened a huge door that will help me expand my genealogy research. Check the State you're researching for existing PROBATE RECORDS and let us know what you find.

**Where was the Deed Acknowledged?** Posted 13 Feb 2017

When heirs are selling property after a death, always look to see where the deed was acknowledged. The deed will have to be recorded in the county in which the property was located, but heirs may acknowledge the deed before a local official where they live. That local official will indicate the location in which he was authorized to act as a notary, justice of the peace, etc. That location can help you to determine where the person was living at the time the deed was acknowledged, even if the deed itself does provide any residential information on the grantors.

## My Genealogy Surprises

Surprise #1: My nephew Sean and I often talked about exploring our genealogy. In 2001, he posted a request on Genforum for any information on my grandmother (father's side), **Mary Wardner Cahill**, originating from New Hampshire. Several months later we received a reply from a Wardner relative who told us of the Wardner Family Association. They listed my grandmother as having four children—she ultimately had nine. We learned we had over 1700 Wardner relatives whose ancestry had been documented in a tome the size of a phone book! Unfortunately, the “book” is not digitized. At that time, it was typed on a typewriter by a since deceased, diligent older relative. Copies were available for purchase at that time, so I do have one. I think the information is currently “stuck” with no one having the time to digitize it, or update it, though a couple of us talked about that need a while back.

Surprise #2: My father's Army Air Corps brothers, **Tom Cahill** and **Jack Cahill**, were killed in action on bombing missions in Europe a few weeks apart near the end of World War II. As was common in many families, painful details of such losses didn't filter down, and our history became fragmented. My brother, my cousins and I knew little about these boys and always assumed we would learn nothing further. In 2012 we found over 500 pages of letters they wrote to their mother during the war. Seventy years after they died, I finally “met” my uncles. The letters also explained a vague sadness I always sensed and helped me to understand the trauma of their loss that had trickled from their generation to mine. To weave our family back together in my mind, I compiled their letters in a book, *Dear Mom: A Family Finds Its Past in World War II Letters Home*. email [mcahill79@comline.com](mailto:mcahill79@comline.com).
